OPENING OF SCHOOL

August 21, 2007 was the school opening and we were excited who will come to join us. We are offering English, Music (Guitar) and Computer classes and the Lord gave us 4 students in English, 5 in the Computer class and 5 in Music. A twelve year old Italian kid, whose parents are working in an NGO firm is the only foreigner student

in the school. The rest of the class are locals or Khmers. Faith is teaching English for beginners and level I while Ariel is teaching Music and Computer. Ariel took PC Operations Course in TESDA Cebu before coming back here in Cambodia and he is putting it to use. Presently, we are grateful for the two Desk top computers donated by Missionaries Genesis Maraas and Joseph Watkins. We are still in need of four more of this equipment for the school. One computer set will cost us \$ 175.

SCHOOL REGISTRATION

We visited the Ministry of Education, Youth and Sports for the registration of the school. The in-charge for Private Schools inspected our place and we are told that our place pass the building and facilities requirements. In Cambodia, you do not need a lavish facility and place to start an International School. We were told that for us (Next page)

to be recognized legally and officially by the Cambodia govern-
ment, we need to go to seven ladder-like heads starting from the
district head up to the Ministry of Education Minister for approval.
The one-time registration fee is \$ 1,400 plus other miscellaneous
fee. We are asking the Lord for directions in this step and please
include this need in your prayers.
