



The Lord is opening many doors through him. Please pray for his family, especially his older daughter, who no longer lives with them. Please pray she'll be more open to instruction from her parents.

SPIRITUAL MEN OF LEHAE

While I'm talking of Pastor Vusi, the church that meets in his house in Lehae (Soweto) has continued to grow, so much so that I was no longer able to organize things by myself, which is a state I usually long for, haha! We've already had two "leadership meetings" among the spiritual men to decide about church activities. When I say *spiritual men*, I really mean it. I've been to board meetings in my life where there's a lot of talk, few decisions and little action—so frustrating! It is not so with these men. In the picture you see me on the left, then Charles, then Vusi, then Nico on the far right. Vusi is a graduate of the Bible school; Nico has one more year to go. Charles will begin his first year in 2018—we hope! (His job doesn't allow him weekends off, so we've got to pray for a solution! He dearly wants to join!) I am grooming the three of them for ministry, and they are all preaching already.

Their training is so *on-the-job* that as I train them all, they also constantly give each other pointers, especially Nico, who is always teaching Charles. Nico is 30, but he's been a youth pastor in another church for years and is very respected.

In Krugersdorp growth is slow. We've had a new member join, and the existing ones are firm in the Lord. Those in training are already starting to teach under my supervision (at Bible studies), but we feel that progress is a bit slow. Please pray with us about the group in Krugersdorp!

The Padayhags, our missionary co-workers, are scheduled to leave South Africa for their furlough at the end of January. Guess who was chosen as the new director of the three branches of the Bible School? Yep, the board all looked at me and there was nowhere to hide . . . kidding, of course. I love the opportunity and the challenge. I'll have to make sure each Bible school branch is up and running by mid-January 2018. I have to do it in such a way that each branch has its own principal, so that when we depart from SA, the schools will continue operating as usual. It's a big transition for the Bible school: it began entirely led by missionaries, and now it will transition into being entirely led by the national/local leaders. I covet your prayers that the other teachers and I would be extra sensitive to the Holy Spirit's leading, because if done right, good fruit will come of it for many generations.
