FROM THE EDITOR

The information which arrives in our office is staggering. Day by day missionaries write concerning their ministry and needs. National field personnel correspond about their ministry and needs. Churches write asking about missionaries and mission goals and share information on their programs and schedules. Donors send in notes with news or questions about something.

Selecting material to include in this issue was difficult. There is so much we would like to inform you of. Often, once the selection is made and the material organized, other news comes in which we wish was included.

Just the day before writing this, we received the June 1993 report from Antonio Improso, Director of the Philippine ministry of TCM. He says, "I am greatly amazed, as I am sure you are also, with the Lord's great goodness in using us in the ministry—empowering, controlling, and so graciously prospering it all the way. He has done this through the years of material leanness and difficult, sometimes most critical, con-

ditions. At the [May] conference, just after I finished reporting the state of the Mission, the latest reports from the field came... Last fiscal year, 46 churches were added to the previous list. The work of evangelism and outreach consistently pushes our frontiers to new areas of harvest. We now have 505 churches with roughly 29,800 members. The numerical growth [an annual rate of 10% over the last fifteen years] is rather more impressive considering the more difficult times during which it came about. At [this] rate, about eight new members are being added to our number daily, 240 monthly, and 2880 yearly. Should the same rate persist through the last years of this decade, we will have well over 900 churches at the dawn of the next century.

"During the last conference 26 new workers were accepted... eleven were ordained."

Praise God! Please take time to read the following articles. Two are lengthy, but we trust the information will challenge and encourage you. Also, please note we have gained a new missionary family while another has retired. ☺

THE DIRECTOR SHARES

My recent trip took me back to the Philippines for two weeks. It was in this country that Pauline and I began our missionary ministry. Pastor Roy Kelsey and I were invited to speak during the graduation exercises at the International Grace Bible Institute (IGBI) Lupagan campus and the dedication ceremonies for the new dorm. The dorm had been needed for some years because of the increase in the number of students enrolled at IGBI.

What a joy it was to participate in the 32nd Annual Commencement Exercises at IGBI. It was hard to believe as I sat there on the stage looking at the graduates that this could be the 32nd commencement. It seemed like yesterday that the doors of IGBI opened to the first student body. Please pray for the 29 graduates of the class of '93 as they enter the ministry of reaching their own people for Christ.

It was a blessing to have two IGBI teachers, former students of mine at IGBI, sitting with me during the exercises. It was exciting to learn that eight of

our TCM pastors have two children each attending IGBI and seven TCM pastors have one child each studying at IGBI--a total of 23 students of former graduates who are now pastors of TCM.

On the morning of the graduation exercises, I was talking with Pastor Ballares (one of our older pastors in the Philippines) who is a supervising minister of 19 TCM rural churches. He has been a very faithful pastor and teacher of the Word of God rightly divided for many years now. He said, "*Pastor Watkins, do you remember in 1959 when you and Bro. Anderson visited my church?*"

I said, "*Yes, I do. How could I forget the 10 hour hike up and down hills. How could I forget my first visit to a tribal people. I still remember that Subannon chief coming down the trail with his five wives and children to attend the church service.*"

Pastor Ballares said, "*That's what I want to talk to you about. That chief and his five wives are*

dead. Before he died he helped organize two churches among the Subannon people. One of the chief's sons is now an elder and we have one Subannon student studying at IGBI. There are two more who want to study. The churches can help one. Will you help the other?"

I told him I would be glad to help. There are about 300 to 400 people in the Subannon tribe. There are only two TCM churches among these people.

Just the other day I received a letter from a former student of mine (one of our older pastors) at IGBI. He, too, tells about his ministry among tribal people on the island of Palawan. "I could find encouragement from God during my remaining years. Last March 30th I was coming home from Puerto Princesa when the jeep we were riding *turn-turtled*. Wheels were up. Praise the Lord no one was injured. Again last April 10th, while coming home from Taytay, one of the front wheels was out of order and the jeep ran away from the road. Praise the Lord no passengers were injured. My wife and granddaughter were with me.



"Today, we have another church in the area of Narra, Palawan. I have not visited this church. But I do have a worker pastoring there. There are tribes of Palawan coming every Sunday."

Pastor Babylonia left the public school as a teacher and came to IGBI to study the Word of God rightly divided and to prepare for the ministry. He was already married and had several children. After Bro. Babylonia had been in the ministry many years, I had the privilege of helping him set up an Elders' Training Center on the island of Negros. Later, he turned this training center over to a younger pastor who graduated from IGBI and he moved on to the island of Palawan.

There are a number of different tribes on the island of Palawan. The pastor who started this church in Narra has graduated from Bro. Babylonia's training center.

TCM's ministry in the Philippines began in 1958 with two missionary families. Over the years the various departments of the work have been turned over to our Filipino brethren. At the present time there are no American TCM missionaries in the Philippines--the ministries

the song. What a wonderful vision! It was the vision of TCM when we started over 35 years ago and it continues to be our vision.

But the gospel of salvation is not the end! Our Lord gave a vision to Paul causing him to write in Colossians 1.28, "we preach [Christ], warning every man, and teaching every man in all wisdom; that we may present every man perfect in Christ Jesus." What a challenge!

**DOES TCM HAVE

After a person is saved, God expects them to grow in the knowledge of the Truth (1 Timothy

2.5, 2.15; Ephesians 3.9). Our vision cannot be considered reached until those we evangelize and teach are in turn evangelizing and teaching those who will in turn evangelize and teach...

**SHOULDN'T WE REACH
THE USA FIRST?**

The vision of TCM, as well as the vision of the whole Grace Movement, must not be limited. Our vision can not be limited to a country

(the USA or Brazil), a people group (Korean or Filipino), or to a particular type of ministry (translation or evangelism).

The need for Grace churches in the USA can not be discounted. Churches and Missions must work together. The churches supply missionaries as well as prayer warriors and financial support for missionaries and field ministries. The mission can help the church by informing them of world needs and concerns. It provides a means for church members to become missionaries. The mission provides a means for church members to reach out to our world.

Ask yourself if the local church is a means to an end or the end itself. Often we think of it as the end, the goal. However, the church is only a means to an end--reaching our world with the gospel (2 Corinthians 5.20) and bringing glory to God (1 Corinthians 10.31).

WHAT IF MY CHURCH DOESN'T SUPPORT OVERSEAS MISSIONS?

It should! No church or Bible study group which has been meeting for more than a few months should be without a mission emphasis. How can we read the Word of God and

not be concerned for missions? God has been, is, and always will be concerned for missions. He is concerned for the world.

TCM would be willing to help you begin a program to acquaint your church or Bible study group with the need and opportunity of world mission.

The local church and TCM need each other and help one another.



Paul uses the human body to picture the Body of Christ--one body but many members working in different functions yet in harmony for a specific purpose. The local church and the mission organization fit together, working to reach our world with the gospel.

WHAT MINISTRIES DOES TCM EMPHASIZE?

Three--1) Evangelism, 2) Leadership training, and 3) Church planting.

WHAT IF MY INTEREST IS IN MINISTRIES OR COUNTRIES TCM IS NOT WORKING IN?

It is important to consider two things. 1) As a member of the Grace Movement, you should realize the movement is dependent upon you. If you are not supporting the movement with your prayers, presence, and finances, it will be limited in the fruit it can bear. Ministries within the Grace movement are dependent upon each of us as members. We who believe in the doctrine and purpose of the organizations must support them.

2) Maybe God is giving you a burden for a particular ministry or country. If TCM is not presently working in a particular type of ministry it doesn't mean we would not begin. Is it possible God wants to use you to begin this particular ministry or support its beginning?

IS TCM OPEN TO NEW MINISTRIES?

Yes! TCM is open to new ministries. As long as the ministry you are thinking about will help evangelize, train leaders, or plant churches, TCM is interested in helping you minister.

IS TCM WILLING TO OPEN NEW FIELDS?

Yes! TCM is willing to open new fields. The mission desires to help you minister. The mission board is interested in discussing our present field needs with you, but if God has laid a burden upon your heart for a particular country or people group, we will discuss this with you as well. ☺

INTRODUCING TCM'S NEWEST MISSIONARY CANDIDATES

Ed and Linda Bedore have been married 25 years and have lived in the Northwest area of Missouri. They both accepted Christ as their Savior in January 1981 through the TV ministry of Kansas City Youth for Christ. While Linda continued to work, Ed began his Biblical and ministerial training at Christ Unlimited Bible Institute in Kansas City. After one year of intensive study, Ed and Linda began a ministry as KC-YFC staff which continued for 2½ years.

In 1984, after leaving KC-YFC, Ed became the Associate Pastor of a church in Independence. After 18 months, Ed became a full-time pastor of a church near Bethany.

In January of 1986, upon understanding the Word of God rightly divided, he left the church and became active in Bible Study and Bible Conference ministries.

Ed and Linda continued their Biblical and ministerial studies with correspondence studies through Covington Theological Seminary of Rossville, Georgia, where Linda received her Bachelor of Religious Education degree. Ed received a Bachelor of Ministry in Pastoral Studies, a Master of Ministry in Bible, and a Doctor of Ministry in Bible. For the past five years he has pastored Grace Bible Fellowship in Bethany and Lucerne Bible Fellowship in Lucerne. In 1988 Ed helped found the Midwest Grace Fellowship. He has served as its President since May 1991.

While reading the Spring 1992 issue of the *INTER-NATIONAL HARVEST*, Ed and Linda began to see how their burden to teach and train men and women for the ministry could help meet a great need on the mission field. After inquiring from Things To Come Mission of specific needs for personnel, Ed and Linda made it a matter of prayer to seek God's will and direction for their future ministry.

They have been accepted by the board of TCM and will begin deputation this summer. 26 YEARS OF MINISTRY WITH TCM

September 1967 was the beginning of 26 years of Bill and Eunice's ministry under TCM. Only eternity will clearly tell the fruit of this ministry but, praise God, we have seen much already.



In the middle of a career in electrical engineering and while pastoring a new and growing church in Anaheim, California, Bill was challenged to be a missionary to the Philippines. Leaving two grown children in the States, Bill and Eunice, with their four youngest children, left their home, their work, their church ministry, their friends, and their family to begin a new adventure!

During 19 years of ministry as missionaries in the Philippines, the Heath's ministry was primarily in the Bible Institute. Both Bill and Eunice taught classes and seminars. Bill's extensive Biblical knowledge and interesting teaching style helped prepare hundreds of Filipino men and women for ministry. Eunice was not only appreciated by the students but was always helping community families deal with emergencies as well as learn more about God's Word. Their generous and gracious hearts endeared them to the students, community members, and mission membership.

Bill's ministry outside of the Bible Institute teaching included: 1) organizing and leading the committee responsible for the class schedule, curriculum, rules, record forms, etc. of our two campuses, 2) providing Bible Study books for our graduates, Pastors, and Bible Women, and 3) writing Bible Study material helping to meet specific needs within the Philippine ministry. This included three books-- "Help in Hard Places," "A City of Two Tales," and "Women's Ministries." He also started the church in Davao City with Mario Indino who is now a missionary serving in Brazil.

***PRAY FOR THE MINISTRY EXPENSE OF THE U.S. OFFICE.** Our fiscal year ended in May 1993. At the end of the year the General Fund had spent over \$6,000 more than had been received. We were able to do this because of an estate gift. However, we have less than \$3,000 left and our average monthly expense is over \$500 more than our income. The cost of postage, phones, utilities, supplies, repairs, and equipment is great. Please make this a matter of prayer. As you pray, God speaks to His children's hearts and can lead them to meet this need on a monthly basis or with a special gift.*

The South African Mission Endeavor

This article is the first of two. Part One is about the Endeavor before our departing to South Africa. Part Two will be about the Endeavor after our return from South Africa. Part Two will be in the next issue of the IH.

Part One:

Have you ever thought about what it is like for a Missionary to raise their support to do the Lord's work?

I must admit, I have given some thought to this matter. As a pastor, we would have missionaries in our home and invited to our church. Also, being the Secretary for the Things To Come Mission Board of Directors has given me opportunity to think about this.

But believe me, I now have a whole new appreciation of the adventure of raising funds for the Lord's work--of what is needed to get the missionary to the field.

As you know, Things To Come Mission is a faith mission. This means each endeavor which will be accomplished will be accomplished by our faith in God's supply.

What do you think a missionary goes through in raising support? This will be a candid expression of our journey for the

purpose of helping you understand what the missionary perspective may look like.

Each missionary and board member of Things To Come Mission must raise their own financial support to accomplish the Lord's work through faithful people such as yourselves. If the supply of the finances do not come in then other alternatives must be looked at.

This dilemma almost occurred with us in regard to the South African Mission Endeavor. Let me explain:

Raising the support to take a family of five to South Africa was going to be a task. I knew that. But what I underestimated in my own mind was how great a task it would be. So when I set out to raise the support for the journey to South Africa, I went out quite naively. I literally had to invite myself to several churches in order to have the opportunity to present what I believed was the Lord's leading for our lives and on behalf of Things To Come Mission.

Sometimes a church offering was less than the cost of travel to and from the church. Some churches promised to send us support for the journey but the promise was not fulfilled. Everywhere we went--to friends, family, churches, as well as other events and places--when people heard about our journey, many people made promises in the financial area but very few followed through.

I was beginning to see what a tremendous task it is for a missionary to get enough support to go to the field. At the same time I discovered how absolutely amazing our awesome God is!

If ever you want to be convinced that there is an Almighty God, you should have a try at raising support for the Lord's Work. Beloved, why do we work our missionaries and God so hard for His money? Is it not His financial blessings in our lives to begin with? Why do we have missionaries traipse all over the country to raise their needed support? In some sense, it is a disgrace to see our missionaries spend so much money going all over the country to have some of them end up receiving only between \$500 to \$1000 a month support. Even this amount is available only if people follow through and are consistent with

their giving of support.

Well, back to the South African journey. Yes, my wife and I drove many miles to raise support. When April 25th came we were still approximately \$1600 short of the air fare that was needed. I was already at work structuring back-up plans in case the needed funds did not arrive. You see, we had to pay for the airline tickets by April 30 or it would cost us another \$2500. And believe me, from where I was sitting, we could not afford the additional cost. Truly from my vantage point that would scrub the trip for the family and activate the back-up plan. Well, as the article is

titled, *Absolutely Amazed* is what I am. By Tuesday, April 27, all of the money was in hand, with the exception of \$300. So by faith (huh!) we booked the tickets hoping that God would continue to supply the \$300 and some additional expense funds.

Why am I *Absolutely Amazed*? Well, for one, I did not expect it to come down to the wire in regard to funds. I really believed the people of God would come through sooner. Just imagine the career missionary who lives by the wire constantly. I wonder how much we are contributing to their stress factor.

Secondly, I wanted to put plans together but could not until I knew if God's supply would be on hand. Just imagine the career missionary who is desirous of planning many spiritual events but must wait for the supply to be sent.

Thirdly, I am *Absolutely Amazed* because God was faithful when I was faith-less! We believed this trip was in the plan of God but I must admit I was not, in the end, living as such. I kept focusing upon the finances to determine many decisions when I should have been focusing upon the Person of God and His will. I imagine many mis-

sionaries can identify with this third point. Think of the decrease in fear missionaries would have if we gave them the support they truly need. Sure they learn how to make do on what they receive, but is that honestly what the Lord wants--that they make do?

Beloved, *Absolutely Amazed* am I. Why? Because where I did not have faith, some of you did. Where I was lacking, God was already in the process of supplying (Philippians 4.19). I am amazed because I learned, somewhat first hand, what our missionaries go through in raising their Missionary Endeavor Support.



G O D !

Will you covenant with me at this time, if you have been inattentive in the past, to do a better job of being consistent in your giving to the missionaries? Will you help to get other supporters on board the financial train to support our Things To Come Mission missionaries? Take to them the message of supporting a missionary and share with them the blessings you have received through supporting God's work in this way. Then

ask your family member, friend, church, or Bible Study group, "won't you come along with me and support the work of Things To Come Mission so missionaries can have peace of mind?"

Won't you also remember with me how important the office personnel is to the missionary? Dan and Jennifer Sidebottom, Jim Younge and Joe and Pauline Watkins were all praying for the needed financial supply.

Dan Sidebottom was a tremendous encouragement to me several times. In my moments of anxiety he helped me to understand the work of the Lord in ways I had not thought about. You see, Dan is a veteran missionary. He knew and understood processes of the Lord in regard to missions that I did not. Remember, I am not a veteran missionary. Having veteran missionaries in the home office of Things To Come Mission has been a tremendous blessing to myself and my wife. Truly, truly, I say unto you, the new missionary and the other veteran missionaries have someone who understands them and their needs both here in America and out on the field. We need to understand that having veteran missionaries in the home office is vital to all of the work of Things To Come Mission.

Yes beloved, we can be proud of the work of Things To Come Mission and its home office personnel. 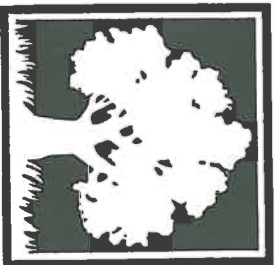
